NON-RECOGNIZED HOME CHILDCARE PROVIDERS

Subject to respecting certain conditions, a person may provide childcare services in a private residence without being recognized by a BC. This childcare environment is not the subject of compliance visits and educational quality is not evaluated..

Keep an educational file for each child

Allocate spaces based on single window registrations

Be the subject of educational quality evaluations, inspections and other verifications by the Ministry or the BC

This person may accommodate six children, including hers, if they are under the age of 9 and a maximum of two infants. Parents may benefit from the refundable tax credit for childcare fees because the spaces are not subsidized.
